AMBIENCE

The campus is also Wi-Fi enabled and has a well appointed canteen as well as facility for both indoor and outdoor games.

PRAYER

LIBRARY

The college library has more than 85,000 books & 1.25 lakh e-books including some very rare editions on different subjects and 4500 periodicals and magazines & Journals to provide updated information. It has a well-equipped Reference Books section as well as a reading room for students. It also has an electronic copier that is used for copying articles and other study materials and library is WI-FI enabled for staff and students.

COMPUTER LABORATORY

The Computer Lab has more than 65 computers with updated software. Students, especially those electing Computer make use of these resources for working on projects guided by faculty. The college also has audio - visual aids and internet connectivity.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE LABORATORY

The English Language Laboratory (ELL) has 25 Computer Stations for teaching-learning and practice. With the guidance of our trained staff and the necessary software, we offer courses of varied durations.

PLACEMENT CELL

L.D. Arts College runs a placement cell too. The reputation of the college attracts companies like Amazing: Solution Pvt Ltd., TCS, IBM, IITJ, Infosoft Pvt. Ltd., Motif etc., HDFC and Hitachi among others. This year itself, some prominent students found placement with attractive packages.

HOSTEL ACCOMMODATION

FOR BOYS : (UG & PG) The Boys' Hostel has a capacity to accommodate 200 students. There are separate blocks for undergraduate and postgraduate students. Each block has a Mess and Dining Hall and is equipped with hot water supply, water coolers, sports facilities and provision for indoor games.

FOR GIRLS : Hostel facility is made available at L.T. Munshaw Ladies' Hostel. Sixty seats are available.

NSS WING

Since 1969 the NSS Wing of the college has remained active. The enthusiasm, energy and immense potential of the students is channelized into serving various causes under the NSS. Whether it is Personality Development Programmes or Cleanliness Drives or Relief Work, the NSS Wing of the college is active throughout the year.

NCC FOR BOYS AND GIRLS

The NCC Unit of L.D.Arts College is attached with the First Gujarat Battalion. It inculcates discipline in the students and is a step towards inculcating patriotism and serving the cause of the nation. The NCC has three wings – Army, Navy and Air Force.

CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

The creativity of the students comes to the forefront in a number of cultural activities all the year through. Most of the activities are totally conceptualised and initiated by the students themselves under the guidance of the Principal and the Cultural Committee. SPORTS :

In the year that went by, at the All India Inter-University Sports Competition, 12 students from the college were selected to represent Gujarat University in various games that included Judo, Table Tennis, Boxing, Handball, Football, Kabaddi and Hockey. In the Gujarat University Ahmedabad Zone Inter College Sports Tournament, 8 students secured First Position and 18 students secured Second Position in competitions in various categories of sports. The college won the championship for Judo (women). The students secured First Position in Boxing, Judo, 400 Metres Race and Relay Race. In Swimming, Cross Country Race (Women), Table Tennis (Women) and Handball (Women), the College came Second.

In the Gujarat University Inter Zone Sports Tournament, 10 students secured First Position and 5 students secured Second Position in Competitions that included Handball, Power Lifting, Boxing, Cross Country, Racing and Judo.

Admission Policy



- 1) Collect the Admission and Affidavit Form from Room No. 1.
- 2) Submit your Admission and Affidavit Form to the Admission Committee along with the following documents.
 - a) Admission Receipt
 - b) S.S.C. Mark sheet (one photo copy)
 - c) H.S.C. Mark sheet (two photo copies)
 - d) School Leaving Certificate (One Photo copy)
 - e) 3 Passport size Photographs :
- 3) Students seeking admission to F.Y.B.A. (Sem-I) Class must have passed H.S.C. Examination with English at First Attempt.
- 4) Students coming from other States and Boards / Universities should obtain Provisional Eligibility Certificate from Gujarat University. They will have to submit the Final Eligibility Certificate before the end of the first semester.
- 5) Admission can not be granted without Provisional Eligibility Certificate for other state students.
- 6) S.C./S.T./S.E.B.C. students have to submit cast-certificate and creamy layer certificate (For SEBC students)
- 7) You are required to submit, Affidavit and duly completed Enrollment Form along with the Admission Form.
- 8) Admission is non-transferable.
- 9) Admission will not be cancelled in any circumstance. The Principal will not entertain any request in this connection.

Important Instructions for FY, SY, TY (Sem -1 to VI) - (CBCS) Students

- 1) From the guidelines for the selection of courses, choose your courses. (Select only One course from each group.)
- 2) As Admissions are granted on the basis of the merit, no change in any course can be allowed later.
- 3) No Fees will be refunded.
- 4) All Computer method, Psychology and Geography students shall have to pay Lab Fee as separate fee.
- 5) Students seeking admission to this college, will be required on compulsory basis, to make an AFFIDAVIT on a prescribed form, that they shall attend 75% of total number of actual lectures delivered in each semester separately.
- 6) The B.A. programme is full time three years Under Graduate programme. The medium of instruction shall be Gujarati and English. The students are allowed

to write the answers in respective medium in the examinations.

- 7) The programme consists of Six Semesters. Semester I and II in the First Year of the Programme, Semester III and IV in the Second Year and V and VI Semesters in the Third Year of the programme. Each academic year shall comprise of two semesters viz. Even and Odd semesters. Odd semester I / III / V shall be from June / July to November / December and Even Semesters II / IV / VI shall be from December / January to May / June.
- 8) The Programme consists of 156 credits equally divided into 26 credits per semester.
- 9) The programme consists of the following types of courses.
 - (i) Core Compulsory Courses in English : common for all optional specialization groups.
 - (ii) Core Compulsory Courses in Indian Languages (Sanskrit): common for all optional specialization groups.
 - (iii) Core Courses : One area of specialization for all optional specialization groups.
 - (iv) Subject Elective Course I and II: Separate for all optional specialization groups.
 - (v) Foundation Course and Soft Skill Course for all specialization groups.
- 10) A Student of First Semester shall be admitted in the Second Semester, if he/she has successfully kept the term in First Semester. To move in the Third Semester students have successfully kept the term in Second Semester, Likewise, to move in Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Semester, students have to successfully kept the term in previous semesters. He/She must have appeared in college internal examination of the previous semesters.
- 11) A candidate must have at least 75% attendance and should have satisfactory performance in class participation of each course and must have appeared in college internal written test to be eligible for grant of semester.
- 12) Students who have 50% to 75% of attendance shall apply for condonation in prescribed form with the Assurance letter along with Rs. 500 deposit as a Financial guarantee.
- 13) Students can't appear in college internal examination who have below 50% of attendance or students who have not appeared in college internal examination are not eligible to appear for the Uni. examination.
- 14) The following shall be the uniform policy regarding internal attendance marks for U. G. and PG. Classes (CBCS)

- 15) The end semester examination, which will be a written-type examination of at least 3 hours duration.
Each course will be assessed on the basis of 100 marks. The marks would be divided between internal and external assessment.
- 16) There shall be one end semester external examination of each course in every semester consisting of 70% (70 marks) weightage in theory and practical courses. Each Theory & Practical course shall have internal assessment of 30% (30 marks) weightage based on the following. (CC, SE-I and SE-II)
Internal Written test - 15% (15 Marks)
Assignment - 05% (5 Marks)
Presentation/Seminars/Quizzes - 05% (5 Marks)
Attendance - 05% (5 Marks)
For compulsory English the internal shall be for 15 (Internal written test) + 10 marks for Assignment + 5 marks for Attendance and Sanskrit the Internal Shall be for 25 marks (internal written test) + 5 marks for Attendance.
- 17) The minimum passing standard will be 36% for the external and internal component of each course, i.e. 25 marks out of 70 and 11 marks out of 30. Every students will be required to pass the external examination and internal examination separately in each course.
- 18) Failed candidates in the Internal examination are permitted to improve their internal examination marks in the subsequent semesters (2 chances will be given) by writing test.
- 19) Students have to submit an Assignment (With Roll No., Subject and paper No.) to concern Professor in 10 to 15 full scap pages in CC, SE-I and SE-2 and 20 to 25 pages in compulsory English.
- 20) A candidate shall be eligible for the conferment of the Degree of bachelor of Arts (Honours) only if he / she has earned the minimum required credits for the programme prescribed therefore (i.e. 156 credits).
- 21) Any student found using unfair means, as per College and University rules and also as per relevant ordinances, during an internal test, shall be given zero marks in the concerned paper/s. In case marks in other papers, are more than passing in the final mark sheet, including attendance marks, they shall be reduced to minimum passing as punishment for malpractice and unfair means.

- 22) No Admission shall be given to any student in the Second/Fourth/Sixth semester of current academic year who shall have not attended 50% of total number of actual lectures delivered in the First/Third/Fifth semester and the University Examination form shall be withdrawn in all cases where attendance of the student is below 50%.
- 23) Out of total internal evaluation marks, 5 marks per paper have been reserved for attendance. The Attendance Marks, will be given as per the above formula. No case will be condoned on grounds of Sports, NCC, NSS, etc. in the matter of minimum requirement of attendance.
- 24) The students must carry their Identity Card. They will not be allowed to attend classes or participate in College activities without their identity card. Students are not allowed to bring outsiders with them in the College premises. A penalty of Rs.500/- shall be charged, in case of infringement of the rule.
- 25) The College expects dignified and disciplined conduct from all the students.
- 26) Students should look upon the College property, building, furniture and gardens as their pride and refrain from disfiguring and damaging them.
- 27) Students should read carefully the Admission Rules, Disciplinary Inquiry and Punishment Rules displayed on the notice board, before seeking admission in this College.
- 28) The formation of the students representative council shall be purely on the basis of merit, admission is granted on this condition.
- 29) A late fee ranging from Rs. 50/- to 200/- shall be charged on late deposit of examination form, semester fee etc after stipulated dates.
- 30) There is a total ban on use of tobacco in the College premises and in the main building. Smoking is prohibited in the campus. A penalty of Rs. 500/- will be charged for infringement of the rule.
- 31) No female/male student shall be permitted in the College premises with objectionable dress as per the opinion of the Principal. Strict compliance to the dress code is expected.
- 32) The College office will remain open for the Undergraduate students between 9:30 A.M. to 11:30 A.M. and 12:30 P.M. to 2:30 P.M. for Post Graduate Students during working days.
- 33) No Student shall be permitted to enter the main building after 7:40 A.M. All Students will participate in the daily prayer.
- 34) Use of mobile phone is strictly prohibited within the College campus.
- 35) There will be no tuition fee for female students at U.G. Level.
- 36) In the case of any kind of Raging, admission will be cancelled and legal steps will be taken.
- 37) The above is only for information and should not be treated as a Legal document.
